All responses are confidential and anonymous. You can choose to stop the survey at any time, however if you would like to submit it, you must complete it in one browser session.

You can provide personal information, such as a contact email, if you would like to be kept informed as the LTIB progresses. Please note, if you choose not to supply this information, we will not be able to keep you informed.

If you choose to provide any personal information about experiences of online harm, this information will inform our development of the LTIB and will be kept private.

Some of the questions ask about demographic information, such as age, gender, and ethnicity. Having demographic information will help us understand the experiences of different groups of the population with online harm and develop suitable responses as part of the Long-term Insights Briefing (LTIB) development.

Any information provided as part of this survey will be stored in restricted files and only allowing certain Ministry staff to access it. You have the right to ask for a copy of any personal information we hold about you, and to ask for it to be corrected if you think it is wrong.
